# Not from the Pulpit: Fr Andrew Bullen SJ

The Reverend Monsignor Eugene Joseph Harley OAM - We note the passing of Monsignor Eugene Harley, long term Parish Priest of Mosman Parish, and a great friend of the Society of Jesus. Principal Chaplain Eugene Joseph Harley (Rtd) served as Chaplain in the Royal Australian Army Chaplains Department, serving in Malaysia in 1961 (2 RAR), Borneo in 1965 (3 RAR) and South Vietnam in 1967. He was awarded the Medal of the Order of Australia (OAM) in the Australia Day 2015 Honours List for his services to the Catholic Church and the Mosman NSW community. RIP.

## **Jesuit Mission Annual Parish Appeal** Sat 20 – Sun 21 May

University student Song Soeurt is 19 years old and studying agriculture. Today his dream of becoming a "professor of Agriculture in Cambodia" seems attainable – but this wasn't always the case. Soeurt is from Tapung, a remote village in Battambang province that bears the legacy of decades of war. The people of Tapung, like many other Khmer, don't have their own land, and can't access good health services, education and infrastructure.

Literacy rates are very low, and unemployment is very high. Soeurt's family couldn't afford to pay for his education, but change came when Fr Sophal, their parish priest, connected the family with an education program run by Battambang Diocese and supported by Jesuit Mission. Students who couldn't otherwise attend high school are supported with hostel accommodation, offering board, tuition and pastoral care. The program also provides scholarships for high school students living at home, and supports university students in Phnom Penh and Battambang. According to his teacher, Soeurt is ... "very hard-working ... and grew much in terms of patience and responsibility" during his high school years. He has been involved with outreach programs in the community, teaching children mathematics and volunteering in summer camps. With the help of our generous community in Australia, Jesuit Mission creates opportunities for young people most vulnerable to poverty and injustice to build skills and resilience. #### Parish Council Report - May 2017

#### At the Strategic Level:

One of our key goals is to ensure that the Parish is sustainable well into the future. Therefore the sustainability of our Jesuit-inspired Parish will, in large part, be dependent on adopting strategies that continue to engage our community - vibrant liturgies, intelligent and meaningful theology, and an active program of social outreach. Consequently, the Parish Council is currently exploring:

- The provision of more opportunities to educate our Parish community in Ignatian spirituality.
- Initiatives to maintain the parish sacramental program into the future.
- Potential cost saving efficiencies by supporting the Parish Ecology Group into the future e.g. Current energy audit and proposed 'pilot' on the St Mary's site, any savings to be re-directed towards a Parish ministry or outreach.

#### At the Operational Level:

As you may know, the Parish Council has appointed three Subcommittees to plan, support and drive various initiatives aligned to our Parish Mission and vision. Some of the current Subcommittee work includes:

- 1. Supporting Volunteers and Ministries.
  - Uploading an updated version of the I CAN DO Volunteers & Ministries booklet to the Parish Website
  - Ensuring display stands for the I CAN DO booklet and Expression of Interest Forms are in each church
  - Connecting the 47 "new" Volunteers to the various Parish ministries
  - Planning a Parish Group Leader and Ministry leaders gathering on Sunday 28th May
  - 2. Lay Ignatian Formation.
    - Preparation of key Ignatian spirituality teachings for monthly insert in the Parish Bulletin
    - Preparation an appropriate Ignatian Examen for use in Masses at the Penitential Rite
    - Planning effective ways of providing Ignatian formation for OLOW Parishioners
  - 3. Reading the Signs of our Times.
    - Facilitating the Mass on Demand services from St Francis Xavier Church in addition to St Mary's
    - Establishing a subcommittee for Youth Engagement to provide advice and support to the Youth Minister and Parish Administration
